[to cast] Alright, let's make sure we've got our best smiles on!

[The audience begins taking photos as the host and cast pose together]

Cast: YES!

How do we make sure everyone in the audience can hear us?

Cast: Projection!

Exactly! And thank you for using projection when you said that. Keep it up!

What's the fancy word we use in theatre for dance?

Cast: Choreography!

That's right! Audience, wait until you see some of the moves in the show, these guys are great dancers!

What do we call where and when to move on the stage?

Cast: Blocking

You got it!

Who is in charge of giving you blocking? The...

Cast: Director

You guys are good! Now, I am going to play the director and let's see if you remember some stage directions: DSR, UPL, & Center. [Cast runs to each after they are called]

Amazing!! There are a few phrases we have talked about this week. I wonder if you can finish them for me?

“If you feel silly, you’re doing it...”

Cast: RIGHT!

That is right, indeed.

Okay and last one, “The show must...”

Cast: GO ON!

And again you’re right this show must get a move on, let’s get our show started!

Cast: Finally!

Okay, okay. You guys get to your starting spots for the show and I will tell them what songs are performing today. “PLACES!”

Cast: Thank you, PLACES! [cast runs to starting places]

[host runs through song/show list for audience]
